

## THE POWER OF GOD

### 1. God has an unlimited power

- a. God's power is "eternal" or infinite (Rom. 1:20)
- b. God can do anything that can be done (Psa. 135:5-6), though it may be impossible for man (Matt. 19:26)
  - 1) Though he does not claim to do logical absurdities
  - 2) Though he does not have to do everything he is able to do
- c. God is omnipotent, Almighty, Elohim ("Strong One")
- d. When dealing with an omnipotent God:
  - 1) We should be cautious about opposing the will of God and making him our enemy
  - 2) We should never hold back a prayer request because we think it sounds too big

### 2. God has an unlimited knowledge

- a. God knows everything that can be known (Psa. 147:5; 1 John 3:20)
- b. God claims to be the only one who knows every detail of past, present, and future (Isa. 41:21-23)
- c. God is omniscient, All-knowing
- d. When dealing with an omniscient God:
  - 1) We should always be honest with God about what we are thinking
  - 2) We should honestly acknowledge those occasions of negative feelings toward others and even God

### 3. God has an unlimited presence

- a. God's presence fills all of space (1 Kgs. 8:27; Jer. 23:23-24)
- b. God is present in all places at every moment in time (Psa. 139:7-10; Acts 17:27-28)
- c. God is omnipresent, All-present, immense
- d. When dealing with an omnipresent God:
  - 1) We should let our actions be guided by the thought that God is always present observing
  - 2) We should never feel alone or afraid

### 4. God has an unlimited existence

- a. God always exists both in eternity past and in eternity future (Psa. 90:1-2; Isa. 46:9-10)
- b. God alone possesses immortality in its ultimate sense (1 Tim. 6:15-16)
- c. God is eternal, immortal, I AM (Exod. 3:13-14), Jehovah ("the existing one")
- d. When dealing with an eternal God:
  - 1) We should never fear being orphaned by God
  - 2) We should seek the wisdom of the ages
